

### Middle Class News:

This term is just racing by! We have been busy as usual cramming in as many activities as possible! A real highlight of the last couple of weeks has been our Water testing day in Naseby. The students loved exploring the different waterways in Naseby and especially finding different creatures that live in the water.





### Water testing at Naseby.

On the 9th of March 2021, St John's school went to the Naseby Swimming Dam to do water testing. We did this to find out how clean and clear the water was. I got put in a group with McKenna and Harry D. Everyone got a turn at doing everything. The conductivity, water clarity test, PH level, temperature, insect and critter hunting and the water velocity (that was only in the water race because it tested how fast the current is moving). The water clarity test was a big clear tube with two magnets and you look through the clear hole. There was a magnet on the inside and outside and someone else slides the magnet on the outside and you look through until you can't see the magnet. That test was to see how clean the water was. To test the temperature we used a big thermometer that tested how warm it was. The critter and insect finding was my favourite. We caught lots of insects and critters like frogs, water boatmen, worms, snails and lots more things. The pH level was a little paper stick with colour on it and the pH level was perfect.

### **Board of Trustees**

- At our February meeting the updated Strategic and Annual Plans for 2021 were presented to the Board.
- The Board received some funding from the Ministry of Education's Covid 19 Urgent Response Fund to use in Term 1. This funding has been used to employ Mrs Angela Francis as a Teacher Aide working and supporting groups of students in the Middle and Senior Classes three mornings a week during Term 1.
- Two new laptop charging stations have been purchased by the Board one for the Senior Class and one for the Middle Class. These allow 30 laptops or i-pads (at each charging station) to be charged in one area and to be stored securely.
- The back hall wall has been replaced with colour steel and looks great. This project has been done in conjunction with the parish, as the parish actually owns the hall.
- We were generously donated 2 TV's. These are presently being installed so that each classroom will have 1 to use, replacing the data screen and projectors.
- The sandpit shade cover has been replaced.
