Collecting of plastic bread tags

We are still collecting the plastic bread tags (no wooden please). These are collected to help fund wheelchairs for those in need in South Africa and to keep them out of landfills. The box for putting the bread tags in is outside the Principal's Office in the office area at school.

Head Lice

Please check your children's hair regularly for this, as it is an ongoing issue. Please treat this when necessary.

School Buses

A reminder that masks are to be worn by students who are in Year 4 and up on all school buses. We have been asked by the Ministry of Education transport advisor to reiterate to parents and caregivers the following points:

- It is the responsibility of the caregivers to get bus children to pick-up locations and to collect them from drop-off locations.
- It is recommended caregivers and children arrive at the bus stop locations at least 5 minutes prior to the time advised by the bus provider.
- Caregivers should stay with their children while they are waiting for their school transport in the morning and meet them in the afternoon as they get off the bus.

Mask Coverings for Years 4 up

Here are the guidelines we have been given from the Ministry of Education re this.

"Staff and children in Years 4 - 13 must wear face coverings when inside at school when we are at Red. Public health advice is that an appropriate face covering will fit snugly and seal well around facial contours. This can include single use, disposable masks (medical masks) and re-usable fabric masks with three layers."

Covid-19

We are regularly receiving updates from the Ministry of Education re Covid-19.

Here at St John's School we will continue to:

- *display QR code posters for the NZ COVID tracer app
- *provide hand sanitizer at entranceways
- *all year 4 and up students will be wearing a mask indoors
- *keep our visitor register and attendance registers up to date
- *be monitoring for illness and asking anyone who is unwell to remain at home, or to go home.

Please ensure if children are unwell, or starting to develop a cold or sore throat, they stay at home.

- *encourage people with relevant symptoms to seek medical advice through Healthline or their GP and get tested for COVID if recommended to do so
- *reinforce the importance of good hand washing and drying
- *reinforce good cough and sneeze etiquette

All parts of our school continue to be regularly cleaned.

Power off

Next Monday the 7th February we have a holiday to remember Waitangi Day.

We commemorate the signing of the Treaty of Waitangi on this day in 1840. Waitangi Day was first commemorated in 1934. The Treaty is often called "The Founding Document" of New Zealand. It is an agreement and exchange of promises made between representatives of the British crown and representatives of Maori.
