Aqua Van

On Thursday 27th, and Friday, the 28th of October the Tiaki Maniototo Project is bringing the University of Otago Marine Studies Centre Aqua Van to the Maniototo! Live marine critters and touch tanks will be set up at Maniototo Area School Gymnasium for both schools to visit over the two days. The Aqua Van is a handson experience that creates awareness and understanding of the importance of stream health and links the Upper Taieri to the Sea. The team at the Aqua Van are extending this opportunity to community members from 3 - 4 pm. This is a perfect opportunity for community members outside school to come along, even bringing your preschool-aged children to look at the marine critters and touch pools.

During the day some students will get the opportunity to go to the Sowburn in Patearoa. Here they will investigate stream health and see an electric fishing display to see what fish live there.

The Middle and Senior Classes have received information about their trip to the Sowburn River at Patearoa next Friday 28th October.

The Junior Class will be walking up to the Maniototo Area School gym to visit the aqua van from 11a.m. - 12p.m. on Friday 28th October. Mrs Hazlett will be taking them to this as I am away at a Principal's workshop that day.

Our thanks goes to Tiaki Maniototo for funding this great experience for our students.

Keeping Ourselves Safe

You have all received a notice earlier in the week telling how all classes are working on this unit of work early this term.

A reminder that we have a parent meeting for those interested in learning more on:

Thursday 27th October from 3 - 3.30p.m. This will be held in the Senior Room.

We are working closely with Police Education Officer Garry Milford, and he will be visiting each class, taking lessons and helping teachers.

He has asked me to inform parents that as part of this programme our school has a commitment to the safety and wellbeing of our students. The programme helps students identify healthy and unhealthy relationships.

Should any student make a disclosure (speak up if they feel that something is wrong or that they are being mistreated) we, as a staff, have a responsibility to report to the Police and/or Oranga Tamariki (Ministry for Children).

As part of the "Keeping Ourselves Safe" programme, in conjunction with the Police, we have agreed to do this.

Athletic Sports Day

We will also be learning about Advent at the end of the term.

*This Sunday is "World Mission Sunday." On this day we pray and think about missionaries around the world as they continue their work helping those in need.

In Maths we are studying Weight and Capacity for the first few weeks and then we will be revising our topics from the last two terms. If you have scales at home, see if your child can read them and predict what

weight items will be. Find items in your home and see if your child can predict which one will be heavier. We are enjoying doing this at school.

Get the children to fill up containers with liquid and read how many mls there are or predict which container will hold more water. Lots of fun!

The older children are reading novels for the first few weeks. There isn't always a book for every child, so some of the children are kindly taking turns to read their homework in class and then will read a book from home for homework.

In Writing, we have been practising our Recount writing and then the children have asked for some writing contracts where they get to choose the type of writing they would like to do from a list of activities.

We have started our Keeping Ourselves Safe topic which in the Middle Primary focuses on the children being in control of their actions and their bodies.

In R.E this term we are starting off with the 'Communion of Saints' topic.

We are practising for Athletics at the moment as well, with an emphasis on doing our best.
