### **Speech Presentation**

The children have continued their positive start to the term and our big focus over the last week has been completing the draft writing and then fine tuning their speeches. Our school presentation day is next Tuesday, the children will deliver their speech using their cue cards and any props that they have. They may ask you to help them find props or they may wish to dress in some way that suits their speech, this is absolutely fine. Any props used need to be linked to a point in the speech and used at the correct time to emphasise this. If dressing up is going to be used, please help your child to be comfortable in the outfit so they are not distracted or fiddling with some part of it, as we want to avoid costume mishaps!

The first two placegetters in each year group will represent our school at the Maniototo Speech Competition on Thursday 1st July at the Ranfurly Town Hall. Our class will attend this competition to support our children presenting.

### **Be an Upstander!**

Today our classroom was filled with bright and happy colours for ‘Pink Shirt Day’. We have continued to grow our understanding of the term ‘resilience’ and this week we have been learning about what effective leadership is and looks like. We have also discussed the idea of being an UPSTANDER when we see mean behaviour and actions and we have learnt about giving compliments. The tips that the children have learnt are

- Say things that are true: people quickly pick up on compliments that aren't true!
- Focus on strengths, qualities, and characteristics instead of appearances.

This week we have really made an effort to be confident and to give the gift of a compliment to others. I have encouraged the children to tell people what they notice they are good at doing and what qualities and characteristics they appreciate about them. It would be great to see this practice continue at home.

The Dunstan Rippa Tournament is to be held on Monday 22nd May at Molyneux Park, Alexandra. From this competition, the top 4 teams in Year 5-6 and Year 7-8 will go on to play in the new Central Otago tournament in Queenstown on the 1st of June.

If you have not already done so, please make sure that each child has been registered online via the link that was sent to your email earlier this week. ***(Fiona Weir sent this to you on Thursday and all participating children need to have this filled in, even if they have registered for Saturday rugby).*** Each child needs to register with the NZ Rugby Union for Accident Insurance purposes and only a parent or guardian can do this.

#### Tournament Information:

- Check The Terrace School Facebook page at 7am. Here, the tournament organiser, Michael Dalglish will post a message confirming if the tournament is on or not. Postponement day is Tuesday.
- This is a 7-a-side tournament with a minimum of 3 girls on the field at all times.
- Games have 9 minute halves, with a 1 minute half time turn around. The game resumes on the referee's whistle.
- No rugby boots with studs, cleats are fine, as are running shoes.
- In this tournament we will be abiding by the same rules as the Central Otago competition in Queenstown with the rule of 6 rips before a hand over occurs.

- We are also aware there have been rule changes in the Year 7 and 8 competition, with the introduction of line outs, etc. WE WILL NOT BE PLAYING THESE RULES THIS YEAR. We hope to bring these in the near future.
- There will be a briefing at 9:15am to let people know how the event will run. Coaches to attend this as it will be where we share any other information that you will need to know.
- The competition will start at 9:30 and run for the day. We hope to be finished by 3:00pm. ***This means that the children will not be back in time to meet the buses, you will need to meet your driver at the St John's School carpark or make an alternative arrangement with the car driver.***
- Our local high school, Dunstan High School, is supplying referees for the day. Please remember these refs are students helping out and giving their time to do so. Do take time to pay the due respects to them before, during and after a game.
- There will be a hooter signal for the start of the game, halftime, and then full time. Refs will manage restart after halftime signal approximately a 1 minute turnaround.
- The scoring system for the day will be 2 points for the win, 1 for a draw, 0 for a loss. There will be a 'points for and against' system to help determine if results are tied.
- The top four teams from each year group will qualify for finals 1 vs 4, 2 vs 3.
- The finals will also be a 10 minute each way game.

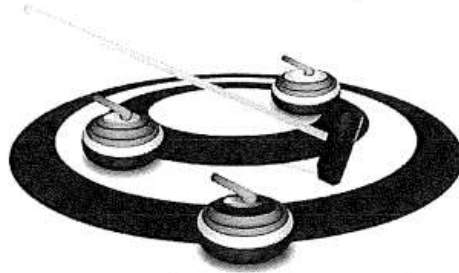

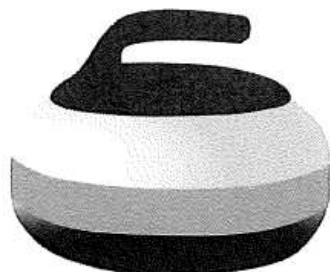
