Parent Consultation

<u>Buses</u>

We have been asked by the Ministry of Education bus liaison person to "remind parents and caregivers that it is their responsibility to supervise their children prior to the children boarding the school bus in the morning and once they get off the school bus in the afternoon. This is especially pertinent during the winter months as visibility is poorer due to the time of year and the weather conditions. School buses are not able to wait at bus stops for children to be collected so it is important that the caregiver is on time."

Hand, Foot and Mouth Disease

This virus is going around in classrooms at the moment. The information below is from the Ministry of Health website. This virus is usually mild and lasts 3 - 7 days. Symptoms include:

mild fever, painful red blisters on tongue, mouth, palms of hands or soles of feet, loss of appetite, sore throat and mouth, general feeling of weakness or tiredness.

The recommendation from the Ministry of Health is to keep children home until blisters or spots have dried up. Frequent hand washing is recommended.

Spelling Course

I attended a two day course on 'The Code' - a spelling programme developed by Liz Kane. It follows a Structured Literacy approach to learning letter sounds and rules for spelling. It was a fantastic course and I learnt a lot from it which I have started to implement into the classroom. I have started to teach spelling explicitly for 20 minutes each day which means that I teach the children the rules and spelling patterns and review them daily. I therefore am not sending spelling words home to learn as the children are doing them in the classroom.

The students enjoyed the Football coaching on the 26th of July. We had Jess come over from Cromwell to teach us some Football skills and then we played some games. Watch out FIFA 2035! There were some great skills and the children loved having little football games against each other.
