Marae Visit

Earlier in the week you should have received detailed information about the school visit to the Puketeraki Marae at Karitane on **Tuesday 24th October**. Dunstan Community of Learning (Kahui Ako) Arts Exhibition

This year the schools in the Dunstan Kahui Ako/Community of Learning are holding an Arts Exhibition at The Central Stories Museum in Alexandra. The exhibition runs from Monday 23 October - Thursday 2 November.

All children at our school will have a variety of artwork from throughout the year displayed at the exhibition and we will be going to Alexandra to view the exhibition on **Monday 30th October**.

The Maniototo Community Trust have generously funded the cost of buses for children and teachers to and from the exhibition for the day and we are very grateful to them for doing this.

This means two buses will leave school on Monday 30th October at 8.50a.m. and we will return in time for children to catch buses home or for parents to collect children at 2.50p.m.

The buses will only be able to transport students and staff. Any parents wanting to come are welcome, but they will have to come in their own transport.

We will visit the exhibition from 10.45a.m. to approximately 12p.m., then have lunch by the playground area near the Central Stories building from 12 - 12.30p.m. We will then go to the Alexandra swimming pool where we are booked from 12.40 - 1.25p.m. We will leave Alexandra at 1.35p.m. to be back in time for children to catch buses home.

Children will need to wear their school uniforms on this day. They need to bring morning tea, lunch (no heated lunch) and enough snacks for the day. They need a drink bottle of water to last all day and they need to bring their swimming togs, towels, goggles etc (all in a bag please).

Athletic Sports Practices

The Maniototo Athletic Sports will take place on **Friday 3rd November**. Postponement date will be Monday 6th November.

We will be having 2 practices at school:

Friday 20th October and Friday 27th October from 1.20 - 2.30p.m. (approximately)

We would like to ask for parent help with these practices. If you can help with taking an activity (high jump, long jump, throwing, running or hurdles), please fill in the form at the end of the newsletter indicating days you would be able to help and then return the form to school asap.

Please then just turn up at 1.20p.m. on the day/s you indicated. Thank you.

Please note you do not have to be an expert at any of these things, just willing to supervise and encourage the children.

Special Character:

On Sunday 22 October our Church remembers Mission Sunday. It is a time where we think about, and pray for those living in situations of poverty, violence and oppression.

Monday 23rd October is Labour Day. Labour Day commemorates the struggle for an eight hour working day. New Zealand workers were among the first in the world to claim this right when, in 1840, the carpenter Samuel Parnell won an eight hour day in Wellington. Labour Day was first celebrated in New Zealand on 28 October 1890.

In Religious Education this term classes will be working on the strand "Communion of Saints" and then later in the term we will be learning about Advent in preparation for Christmas.

Junior Class News:

Early this term we will be preparing for our visit to the Puketeraki Marae at Karitane. We will be learning about parts of a marae, the procedures when we get to the marae and stories of early Maori life from around this East Otago area.

We will be running each day to get fit for the Athletic Sports being held on Friday 3rd November. There will also be an opportunity for children to practice various skills for athletics.

Middle Class News:



Welcome back to Term 4!

It's great to see all the children back and happy to be at school.

We are spending the next couple of weeks getting ready for our Marae sleepover. In class, we are learning about Pūrākau which are Maori Myths and Legends and retelling them. We will be going over our Mihi and practising saying it to each other.

We are also practising two songs for the Marae trip, they are Te Aroha and E Toru Nga Mea. Your child has brought home notices this week about the marae food to be donated and the gear list. Please let me know as soon as possible if you need help with any of this.

In Maths, we have started Fractions this week. The children are learning about what fractions represent and how to use them in an equation.

Last term we were studying Time and it would be great if you could keep going over this with your children at home. Using an analogue clock to read - o'clock, half past, quarter to and quarter past. This seems to be particularly tricky for some children.

In Reading, we are continuing at the moment with Journals for most groups. There is a lot of information in a Journal story and my key focus is on the children comprehending what they are reading. We dissect the stories and pick apart what the author is telling us. There are some very interesting stories and we are learning a lot from these.

We have started practising for the upcoming Athletics. It is great to see the children building their confidence at the different events as they learn how to do them properly.

Thank you for your continued support with your children's schoolwork.


