We have three sessions planned with Anna this term.

The first session will be on: **Friday 10th November p.m.** with each class timetabled to go with Anna during the afternoon on this day.

Children will wear the beekeeping suits and gloves that we purchased but they <u>must</u> bring gumboots from home to wear. This is very important and the children will not be able to go over to the beehive area without gumboots. If your child does not have gumboots please let us know.

The first session will be a very basic session with Anna showing us how to put the bee suits on, rules around the beehives and some basic information. We are looking forward to learning about these important creatures.

#### **Concert practices**

We have started learning the songs for our school concert and children in the Middle and Senior Classes have their parts to learn now. From Monday the 13th November until Thursday 23rd November we will be practicing each morning in the Ranfurly Town Hall beginning each day at 9.15a.m. so our normal school timetables will be different for these two weeks.

The suffix "een" is an abbreviation of "evening". Halloween refers to the Eve of All Hallows, the night before All Saints' Day, the Christian holy day that honours saintly people of the past.

All Souls' Day is a day to pray for all souls. It is the day that we especially remember all those who have died, especially our relatives and friends.
