Staff 2024

We have one staff change this year as Mrs Rachel Gray is on maternity leave. Mrs Erin Elworthy will be teaching the release times for 2024. She will be in the Junior Class all day Wednesdays and Thursday afternoons and will teach in the Senior Class on a Thursday morning until morning tea time and in the Middle Class from after morning tea until lunchtime.

I continue to teach the Junior Class; Years 0, 1 and 2, Mrs Heather Dowling Years 3, 4 and 5. Mrs Geraldine Duncan is the teacher of Years 6, 7 and 8.

Mrs Jayne Hazlett will continue to work three mornings (Monday, Tuesday and Thursday) with individual students in the area of literacy. Literacy includes reading, reading comprehension, writing, spelling, alphabet activities and speech. Teachers have identified students with particular needs to work with Jayne. Sharon Thompson will be working as Teacher Aide in the Senior Class 4 mornings a week with Becky Bruhns as Teacher Aide in the Middle Class 4 mornings a week and Angela Francis 4 mornings a week in the Junior Class.

Waitangi Day

School is closed on Tuesday 6th February for Waitangi Day (this is a public holiday.)

Stationery

Children have been issued with new exercise books and a stationery account.

These accounts include Mathletics (an online maths programme that supports the class programme) for the Middle and Senior class students.

Exercise books can be covered as this protects them from many things, but this is not a requirement. If you would like to cover your childrens' books please ask them to bring the books home one night to do this. Thank you.

Swimming

Our swim week for the whole school is taking place next week, 5 - 9th February (not Waitangi Day). We are very lucky that our PTA pay for a private swimming teacher, Jo Blackie, for this week and we thank them for this.

Individual class teachers will let you know when their class is swimming so look in class notices for this information.

A reminder that children need to bring their swimming gear in a bag of some sort that is easy to carry to swimming. It is also helpful if all children's uniform items have a name on them somewhere, for when clothing gets mixed up! Thank you.

Telephone

A reminder, please, that when ringing the school cell phone or landline, do not leave a message after 1.15p.m. as teachers are in their classrooms teaching, and there is not always someone in the office to clear messages until after school. The cell phone is also difficult for teachers to access and hear, in class time.

If your child/children are going to be absent from school, please ensure that the classroom teacher is aware of this by texting the school cell phone before 8.30a.m. We are obliged to follow up any absences if we have not been notified of these. It is also helpful if you give a reason your child is absent as we have to code daily absences into our student management system, eg, sickness, doctor appointment, etc.

Computer and Internet Use Agreement/Internet Safety

Students are asked to read and sign a Computer and Internet Use Agreement. Parents are asked to go through this with their children so children understand rules around use of laptops and computers. As a staff we put photos of children in our newsletter but at times we are asked for photos for other media, eg Positively Maniatoto, Tiaki Maniototo. We try to text parents of individual children to get permission prior to doing this but it can be overlooked if in a hurry or busy. We also only try to give photos where there are larger groups and individuals are harder to identify.

If you do not want your child's photo put on other publications outside of school please fill in the form attached to this newsletter and return it to your class teacher. Thank you.

Pie Warmer/Microwave/Sandwich Press

We have a pie warmer available for children to use to heat pies, savouries, etc. We also have a microwave children can use to heat basic food items at lunchtimes. The Middle and Senior Class have a sandwich press they can use to toast sandwiches at lunchtime.

School Buses

Each year we are asked by the Ministry of Education transport advisor to reiterate to parents and caregivers the following points:

- It is the responsibility of the caregivers to get bus children to pick-up locations and to collect them from drop-off locations.
- It is recommended caregivers and children arrive at the bus stop locations at least 5 minutes prior to the time advised by the bus provider.
- Caregivers should stay with their children while they are waiting for their school transport in the morning and meet them in the afternoon as they get off the bus.

Each bus student will receive a "Bus Transport Code of Conduct" this week, which is to be read, discussed and signed by both the student and parents, then returned to school. Thank you.

Wow! What a fantastic start to the term we have had!




I feel very lucky to be teaching the children in the Middle Room.

BUS TRANSPORT CODE OF CONDUCT

My family and I understand and accept the following school bus rules.

- . sit down quietly in my seat
- I will:
- . put my bag on the floor or on my knees
- wear my seatbelt, if there is one, and stay in my seat while the bus is moving •
- wait until the bus stops before I leave my seat .
- walk quietly from the bus when I get off. .
- throw anything out of the windows ٠ I will not:
 - eat or drink on the bus .
 - distract the driver while the bus is moving .
 - be disruptive or annoying to other passengers. .

If I have a concern, I will tell the bus monitor or bus driver.

If I misbehave on the bus, the bus monitor/bus driver may report it, and I may be shifted to a different seat on the bus, or excluded from travelling on the bus for either a set time or indefinitely.
