





introduced to and inspired by classical, instrumental music. Kinga is a piano teacher as well


as a professional performer, and she is very keen to make this opportunity as accessible to

Boil Water Advisory for Ranfurly and Patearoa Update

The Boil Water Advisory for Ranfurly was lifted on Tuesday 2 September 2025. Residents no longer need to boil water for drinking or food preparation.

A temporary ultraviolet (UV) treatment plant has been installed to meet the required drinking water standards. This temporary plant will remain in place until the water treatment plant upgrades are completed.

Please note: the Boil Water Advisory for Patearoa remains in effect. Upgrade work on the Patearoa Treatment Plant is being prioritised and is progressing well.

Council acknowledges the inconvenience this advisory has caused and sincerely thank the residents for their patience, cooperation and resilience throughout this period.
