Phone Messages

On the mornings that Fiona Weir works in the office (Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday), she will take all the phone calls and messages.

Please text in to school by 8:50am if your child is going to be absent and the reason for their absence. The teachers have to code the absences daily and they get sent to the Ministry of Education. If your child has too many unexplained absences, it could result in a notification being sent to the Attendance Office of the Ministry of Education.

In the afternoons, the cellphone is with the classroom teachers and is not always monitored, or we don't hear it. Please try to text or leave a message before 1:15pm if possible.

Digital Technology Use Agreements

Students have been asked to read and sign a Digital Technology Use Agreement with their parents this week if they are in Year 3-8. This is so they understand how to use the computers and the internet safely.

During the year, the staff take photos of individual students or groups at school, on camps or other outdoor activities. These are for use in our classrooms or in the school newsletter.

Sometimes we get asked for photos of what's happening in our school for other publications such as the Positively Maniatoto or Tiaki Maniototo. If you do not want your child's photo published in other publications please let us know by filling out the form in the back of this newsletter.

Stationery

All the children have received their new stationery at school. If you would like to cover your children's books, you are welcome to do so by taking them overnight and bringing them back the next day. This is not a requirement.

Also, please fill in up-to-date medical information for children eg, any new allergies and ensure that your child's class teacher is given any up-to-date medication they may need at school.

School Day Times

A reminder that the school does not open until **8:30am** each morning. Please do not send children to school before this time.

The school bell rings at **8:50am**, and it is important that the children are at school at least 5 minutes before this as they need that time to get organised for the day. If the children arrive at school late, it is disruptive for the class and they may have missed leading class activities.

Sometimes we have to leave school promptly to get to meetings in Alexandra, so it is important for us to know if parents are running late.

The school day finishes at **2:50pm**.

Lunchtime is **12:30-1:15pm**.

School Buses

Each year, we are asked by the Ministry of Education transport advisor to reiterate to parents and caregivers the following points:

- It is the responsibility of the caregivers to get bus children to pick-up locations and to collect them from drop-off locations.
- It is recommended that caregivers and children arrive at the bus stop location at least 5 minutes prior to the time advised by the bus provider.
- Caregivers should stay with their children while they are waiting for their school transport in the morning and meet them in the afternoon as they get off the bus.

Information Evening



We welcome new 5 year old, Chester Weir, to St John's School.




Week 1

Last Thursday the Junior class read the story "Bubbles". After this we had fun blowing bubbles both inside and outside.




Then on Friday we read a book called "The Giant's Ice Cream" and we enjoyed eating a lemonade iceblock afterwards.

Middle Class News



Special Character News

Waitangi Day

On Friday we have a public holiday to commemorate Waitangi Day. Although recognised as a significant day since its signing in 1840 it did not become a national holiday until the 1970s. The Waitangi Day Act 1960 declared that 6th February would be known as Waitangi Day and would be observed throughout the country as 'a national day of thanksgiving in commemoration of the signing of the Treaty of Waitangi'. The call for the 6th of February to be a nationwide public holiday continued from the early promises made in 1957. Prime Minister Norman Kirk announced that from 1974 it would be a national holiday.

Wednesday 18th February is Ash Wednesday.

We will be celebrating the beginning of the year school Mass and Ash Wednesday on this day at **9a.m.** in our parish Church. Everyone is welcome to join us for this.

Ash Wednesday is the beginning of the Church season of Lent, which is 40 days of preparation for Easter.

Traditionally, Ash Wednesday and Lent were times of fasting and abstinence. But now we are encouraged to put God first in our daily lives and do more to help others. We all receive a cross of ash on our foreheads at our Ash Wednesday Mass to remind us to live like Jesus did.
